> KATHERINE MASON YOUNG

Etiquette Essentials, Campuspeak

Katherine Mason Young has been speaking and instructing social skills, confidence and etiquette courses nationally with the JDW Social Education Programs for over 18 years. She is a graduate of the University of Colorado with degrees in International Business and Marketing.



Katherine received her greatest cultural education while traveling around the world on the S.S. Universe – Semester at Sea. She then worked protocol during the World Economic Summit of the Eight, and has extensive international travel experience.

Katherine has appeared on CBS Sunday Morning, national television news broadcasts and KNUS – Success Talk Radio program. As Executive Director of ESP (Executive Social Presentation), her projects include corporate seminars nationally, in addition to regular engagements for Rocky Mountain Jr. Achievement, Leaders Challenge, The National Charity League and several academic, volunteer, and debutante organizations nationwide.

> KATHERINE "KATHY" REDMOND

Founder, National Coalition Against Violent Athletes

Katherine Redmond started the National Coalition Against Violent Athletes when her historic Title IX case against the University of Nebraska and her perpetrators was settled in 1997. After learning how to navigate the system that protects athletes and vilifies victims, she announced its formation in New York City in 1998 and made ending athlete violence her life mission.



Since the formation of the NCAVA, Redmond, a former college lacrosse player, has forged herself as a national expert in athlete violence and response. She is a gender-based violence prevention and response consultant to the New England Patriots and Major and Minor League Baseball.

Redmond was named Swiffer's Amazing Woman of the Year, an Everyday Hero by Reader's Digest and was nominated for Cosmopolitan Magazine's Fabulous Female award, among others. Kathy lives in Denver with her two boys, Adam and Micah.

> JEANNIE RITTER

Former First Lady, State of Colorado Ambassador, Mental Health Center of Denver

As Colorado's first lady from 2007 to 2011, Jeannie Ritter used her platform to advocate for mental health. She continues this role as Mental Health Ambassador at the Mental Health Center of Denver. Every year she speaks at hundreds of businesses, civic organizations, faith-based groups, chamber meetings and community gatherings.



Jeannie used to say she chose mental health as the issue she would champion because she had been a classroom teacher for children with severe challenges, and because she had a sister with a bipolar diagnosis. But over time, her answer has changed. Now, it's about the whole family—everybody's family. Look at family photos and you'll see loved ones who have experienced substance use, anxiety, depression and more. Mental health is an issue about which we all must talk. Our leaders have greatly increased their ability to speak about mental health and through her experience, Jeannie helps organizations be able to discuss mental health in a productive and positive manner.

> MATT VOGL

Executive Director, National Mental Health Innovation Center University of Colorado - Denver

Matt has a passion for bold new ideas to take on mental health challenges. In fact, that passion was a driving force behind the creation of the National Mental Health Innovation Center (NMHIC). As the lead executive, he reports both to the Chancellor of the CU Anschutz Medical Campus and the NMHIC Board of Directors.



Before taking on leadership of the NMHIC startup, Matt served as Deputy Director of the University of Colorado Depression Center and managed program expansion for the Nurse-Family Partnership, an evidence-based maternal-child nurse home visiting program.

Matt earned his BA from Marquette University and a Masters of Public Health from the University of Minnesota. He is past Board Chair for the Suicide Prevention Coalition of Colorado and has served on the boards of the Rocky Mountain Research and Prevention Institute and the Colorado chapter of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention. He recently was appointed to the State of Colorado Commission on Suicide Prevention.

OFFICIAL RULES OF CONVENTION

- 1. Speakers should identify themselves by name, chapter, and class when recognized by the Presiding Officer and before addressing the Convention.
- **2.** All brothers may be recognized by the Presiding Officer and can speak and make motions. The right to vote and second motions is restricted to accredited delegates.
- 3. All accredited delegates should sit near the front of the meeting room.
- **4.** All members are expected to attend the Convention in appropriate dress. No alcohol may be consumed during the Convention Sessions or Leadership Training Conference. All business sessions are non-smoking.
- 5. The standing Convention Committees shall be:
 - a. Committee on Credentials
 - b. Committee on Conventions
- c. The Presiding Officer shall have the power to name other committees as he deems necessary for matters to be brought before the Convention and shall have the power of selecting the Chairman and members of any such committee required.
- **6.** Each such committee appointed shall be prepared to report its deliberations at the Regular Convention Sessions.
- **7.** No new business may be introduced at the Convention from the floor after the close of the Second Regular Session (Friday Afternoon).
- **8.** Robert's Rules of Order shall be used as a parliamentary guide, except that all questions of procedure shall be resolved by the Parliamentarian of the Convention unless delegates, by two-thirds vote shall otherwise determine.
- **9.** Where feasible, any delegate making a motion or proposing an amendment to a motion from the floor, shall present the Secretary of the Convention with a written copy of such motion or amendment at the time it is made.
- **10.** Due to the pressure of time, debate may be cut off by a majority vote, unless the Presiding Officer rules it an important question where a two-thirds vote is required for closure.
- **11.** Delegates are expected to attend all Convention Sessions. If delegates leave the Convention early or do not attend Sessions, their Convention subsidies may be reduced proportionately by the Budget Committee of the Board of Governors.
- **12.** Only members of the fraternity and invited guests of the Board of Governors will be allowed to attend the Regular Convention Sessions. Any individual may attend the Leadership Training Sessions, lunches, dinners, and/or banquets.

- 13. During Convention Sessions, electronic communication devices such as telephones or pagers may not be used, and must be set to an inaudible state.
- 14. The Secretary of the Convention shall tape record all business sessions of the Convention
- 15. If a chapter or alumni organization specifies or registers a member brother for attendance at the annual convention and that individual fails to attend the convention in an unexcused manner that member's organization will be billed actual costs by the Alpha Delta Phi International for each individual with payment due by October 1st of that year.

> CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

The Credentials Committee consists of four members from the Board of Governors, Executive Office, and general membership. The Committee examines the credentials of the delegates to the Annual Convention. It also determines voting qualifications of each official delegate. The Committee will report its findings prior to the start of the Annual Convention.

ARTICLE IX. You do solemnly promise that you will never, in any manner, either by word, look, or sign, or in any imaginable way, disclose or divulge, or cause to be disclosed or divulged, any of the acts, laws, designs, or its proceedings of this Society; and that you will do your utmost to draw a veil of perfect secrecy over all its concerns, until your connection with it shall be dissolved by death.

ARTICLE X. You do solemnly promise that with respect to every brother member of this Society, you will at all times and places, and under all circumstances, and on all occasions, do everything in your power to defend, support and maintain his moral and social character and his intellectual and literacy reputation; and that whenever he shall be unrighteously accused of malignantly slandered, you will repel the attack with an honest and manly indignation, and that whenever you may hear of false reports, which may operate to his injury, you will endeavor to prevent their further circulation in short in all things which pertain to his personal character, and his reputation with his associates and the world, you will espouse his cause as if it were your own, and that you will constantly exercise towards him a spirit of charity, kindness and fraternal love.

HISTORY OF THE ROCKY MOUNTAIN AFFILIATE

Lucas Zahorik has Greek life in his blood. His father is a Kappa Sigma and his mother a Chi Omega. They both maintained relationships with their brothers/sisters, and Luke remembers, even from elementary school years, meeting his parents' college friends and seeing the bond that they still had. So it was only natural that when he matriculated at the University of Alabama, he rushed fraternities.

Things were a little different in Alabama than in his home state of Colorado. People were very concerned with what town in Alabama you came from, and Colorado was like another planet. At most fraternities, when they found out where Luke was from, they ignored him. But at the Alpha Delta Phi chapter, they understood how to run rush and they didn't care where he grew up. Luke pledged and was initiated into the Alabama Chapter in November 2014, a member of their Delta pledge class. Unfortunately, Luke's discomfort with the cultural disconnect continued outside the fraternity walls. After a year at Alabama, he realized he was unhappy and that the only thing keeping him there was Alpha Delta Phi.



He finally decided that he needed to transfer back home, to the University of Colorado at Boulder. Though he missed the fraternity bonds, it did not initially occur to him to start a chapter of Alpha Delta Phi. That is, until two of his friends from high school were each elected President of their respective Greek organizations. At that point, his competitive instincts were triggered and he began to pursue the vision of a Rocky Mountain Chapter of Alpha Delta Phi.

After gaining permission from the International to begin recruiting efforts, he posted a notice on the Alpha Delta Phi Facebook group. This drew the attention of Robert Gilbert, WASH 1981 who passed it along to his son Collin. It was also noticed by Stephen Cheesman ADEL 2014, who connected with his younger brother Thomas Cheesman and his roommate, Keagan Vernon. Both Thomas and Keagan had just finished rush at CU without finding a fraternity that worked for them. They immediately recruited some hall-mates, some other members of their Delta Sigma Phi business fraternity, and the founding pledge class of the Rocky Mountain Affiliate was constituted. The founding class was initiated on April 16, 2016 with Brother Zahorik officiating, along with Brothers Stephen Cheesman, Charles Acquisto, BUFF 1986, Erik Roisland, R 2015, and David Jilk, LP 1985 as attending alumni.


